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### **High School Finds New Home at Richmond Town Square**

**RICHMOND HEIGHTS, OH (October 6, 2008)** – Soon high school students will have a whole new reason to go to Richmond Town Square Mall.

On October 16, 2008, Indianapolis-based non-profit Simon Youth Foundation (SYF) and the Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County will open the North Coast Academy, an alternative high school serving 13 area school districts.

“The Richmond Town Square facility offers greater possibilities of expanded programming, career opportunities and new partnerships,” said Dr. Harry Eastridge, Superintendent, Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County. “Most importantly, the at-risk youth attending North Coast Academy will attend a facility that is located in a welcoming environment that demonstrates they are valued by their community and school district of residence.”

The North Coast Academy opening is made possible by a donation of under-utilized space from Sears Holdings Corporation at the Sears store in Richmond Town Square and was designed by Dorsky Hodgson Parish Yue Architects. It offers students and teachers four classrooms, a science lab, offices, a conference room, reception area, and a staff lounge.

North Coast Academy is one of 24 Education Resource Centers (ERCs) SYF has established in 11 states across the U.S. Located primarily in malls, ERCs serve students who have been unsuccessful in the traditional setting for reasons such as teen pregnancy, truancy, lack of motivation different learning styles, issues with high student-to-teacher ratios, or social-interaction problems.

ERCs are not designed to be harder or easier than traditional high schools, just different in approach. While every student at North Coast Academy must pass Ohio’s requirements for graduation, small class sizes enable students to seek one-on-one assistance, on-line academic software allows students to work at their own pace and class days are shorter, to accommodate students with additional responsibilities. Despite



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serving an at-risk student body, North Coast Academy boasts an 80 percent graduation rate and 278 students have earned their high school diplomas at the ERC.

“Simon Youth Foundation could not be more pleased about the collaboration with Sears Holdings to offer the Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County with a state-of-the-art facility,” said SYF Executive Vice President, Dr. Richard Markoff. “The traditional school setting doesn’t work for every student, so our goal is to help the districts offer them the personalized attention they need in order to succeed in high school and throughout their lives.”
