Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County Superintendent Dr. Harry Eastridge plans to retire

With the new year will come a change in leadership at the Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County.

Dr. Harry Eastridge, ESCCC superintendent since 1994, announced his retirement this week. Eastridge will continue on as superintendent through the end of his contract in August.

The ESCCC serves all the 31 districts in Cuyahoga County and, because of state law, has a special governance responsibility to serve the local districts of Cuyahoga Heights, Independence and Richmond Heights local schools.

ESCCC is the largest service center in Ohio, employing 1,100 full- and part-time employees in Cuyahoga County alone, representing 124,000 students, plus Cleveland through other contracts. Services range from programs for "at risk" students to gifted programming and leadership and support initiatives.
